#### From the Pastor's Desk

I want to share an email with you from a friend of mine. Having just celebrated Easter we now look forward to Pentecost: the giff of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the church. These words help us to make a connection between the two:

"Retelling the Easter story of Jesus' first appearance to His disciples after His resurrection (John 20:19-23) is like living into the truth of our own lives. It is a story of transformation that provides the key to the power of the Easter reality in our lives.

The power of Jesus' resurrection lies in God's ability to turn death into life, or in the case of Jesus' disciples, transforming a fearful room into a joy ful one (20:19-20). Jesus does not come into our lives to make it more difficult than

what it already is. As He did when He spoke his first words in the midst of the disciples, His presence brings peace.

God's new life in and through Jesus' resurrection is the ever-present reality of God showing up in our lives to surprise us with newness in the midst of stuckness. God brings peace and joy in the midst of fear and anxiety.

But the story does not end there. The transformation from fear to joy effected by the peace of new life in and through Jesus leads to a completely different purpose in life. It is a transformational power that moves us into the world for the sake of bringing new life to others. In the words of Jesus, "As the Father has sent me, I am sending you... If you forgive any-



one his sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven" (20:21, 23).

The key verse between the previous two verses provides the crucial link for understanding God's sending and our calling in the light of God's power alone: "... He breathed on them and said, 'Receive the Holy Spirit'" (20:22)."

May the Easter power of Jesus' resurrection move you forward on the holy gusts of the Spirit and into the lives of others to bring peace, hope, and newness!

From March 11-18, 31 people from a variety of back grounds and congregations throughout the Eastern United States met in **Sabaneta de Yasica**, **Dominican Republic**, to carry out the annual mission trip planned by New Wilmington and Clen-Moore Presbyterian Churches. From Clen-Moore, Chris Weichman, Aaron Christy, Joel Nesbitt, and Tina Nesbitt participated in the mission trip.

This partnership of support from the

local evangelical congregation was again a great success this year. Medical clinics served more than 1,000 local people, and were blessed to have a dentist among our practitioners. The construction crew joined some Dominican friends to pour concrete floors into homes which had previously been dirt, remedying health issues and stabilizing foundations. The scholarship program was updated and plans made for the upcoming 2012-2013 school year. A

sports camp was conducted with the local preteens and teenagers, focusing not only on developing volleyball skills but also on the phrase "God First, Others are Second, I'm Third," allowing for meaning ful interactions throughout the week. Participants in the trip would agree that they were among the most blessed of those involved in the week's happenings.
