

From the Pastor's Desk: Opening the Doors to Mission

Several months ago, a group of Clen-Moore members began to meet to talk about how they felt the Spirit was moving in the church.

With the renovations in the church almost complete, there was a feeling that God is calling the church to open its doors in mission and ministry. We discussed what that meant. We asked, "How the church might become more involved in the community, especially with those in need?"

As the Holy Spirit led us, we came to realize that we are already doing a great deal in the



community, but have done a poor job in communicating this and involving the congregation. The question arose, "How might we do a better job communicating and involving the congregation in the mission of the church?"

Starting in worship this month, we will highlight a local mission each month with "Moments for Mission," testimonies, and activities. This month, we will hear about Feed My Sheep, a ministry on the Southside of New Castle (see page 2).

Eleven different groups - including Sunday School classes, the Youth, the Choir, and Men's Ministry - have already been involved with Feed My Sheep, serving lunch to those in need on the first Tuesday of every month. We will have Moment for Mission



from the Director, Pam Thiery, and another week a client will share their testimony.

In October, Kevin Green, the Executive Director of The City Rescue Mission, will speak about the work of the Mission.

We hope to better inform you about all that your church is doing in our community. We'll also provide you with easy ways to get involved and support the Lord's work in our city.

It is amazing how God is using this church to reach out and touch lives. I think you will find the coming months inspiring!

September Mission Spotlight: Feed My Sheep

Feed My Sheep is an outreach program on the Southside of New Castle. It works to serve families in need through food & material goods as well as spiritually.

Each Tuesday at 11:00AM begins a half-hour program of praise music, prayer, and a brief message, followed by a full-course lunch and a clothing/households goods giveaway program.

Once a month, Clen-Moore contributes a home-cooked lunch for about 100 people in need. Various groups have taken turns at preparing, delivering & serving the meal, including the choir, Sunday School classes, and the Men's Ministry.

On **Saturday, September 12,** Clen-Moore will host a prayer & thanksgiving service for Feed My Sheep. The entire



congregation is invited to attend the sevice, scheduled for 5:00PM.


