From the Pastor's Desk: Worship Rated "G"

One of the great joys I have in worship at Clen-Moore is the Children's Message. The children's energy and spontaneity bring joy and "adventure" to worship.

Children have always been important members of the church community. This year the Christian Education committee has been exploring how we might more fully include children in the worship life of the church. As the Christian Education committee and the Music & Worship committee have continued to look at the body of Christ in worship, we see children have much to add

to enrich the worship life of our congregation.

We are planning ways in which we can incorporate the children more thoroughly in the wor**ship service** such as: filling the font for baptism, lighting the candles before worship, collecting the offering, and leading responsive readings. Starting in January, we would like to invite children in grades 4-6 to stay in worship after the children's message so that they might become more acclimated and active in worship.

This addresses two

sues: First, the range of children participating in Children's Worship is from Kindergarten to sixth grade. Not only is it a large group, but to teach children who range in age from 6 to 12 is not effective.

Second, children need to be intentionally included and encultured (formed) into the faith, life, and worship of the church. Worship becomes a foreign practice if, for the formative years of their life, a young person is sent out of sanctuary only to

This year's Thank Offering speaker will be Susan Reichart from **Pine Valley Bible Camp** in Fombell, near Ellwood City. In May of 1995, the Lord called Matthew & Susan Reichart to Pine Valley to

begin its partner ministry of providing residential camping to Pittsburgh's inner-city youth. The Reicharts had a

dream to help inner-city kids come to know Christ as their personal Savior. At a time when many would have said it was a nightmare, Matt & Susan started on a mission.

In 1995, they were living in a small cottage and using an old trailer as their bedrooms, with five children ranging in age from six to 12. They were offered the gift of a five-bedroom house if they could raise the money and move it from Cranberry Township to Fombell.

Matt said "I have read so many times 'If you have the faith of a mustard seed, you can say to this mountain, 'Go into the sea; and it will be done.'" As they prayed, they felt the Lord say, "If faith can move a mountain, this is just a home." They accepted the gift and got to work. The house came with a condi-

lumber taken for salvage. Two days before the deadline, all the money was raised and Pine Valley Camp was a dream coming true.

Their dream has continued to grow each year with the help of many talented people. Last summer, 559 youth went to camp and heard the Gospel of Jesus Christ. **425 professed a relationship with Christ.** Nine new ministries sent kids to camp. Mission Vision gave free corrective lenses to the campers for a second year in a row. Fifteen teens participated in the Camper-in-Training program. And several campers participated in professional tennis lessons sponsored by JADCO Manufacturing, Inc.

They have had a gym donated; it has to be assembled. They need a dining hall and some more cabins, and there is always an opportunity for people to use their skills as a lumberjack since eight fireplaces need to be fueled about six months per year to help save on oil, gas or electric. Each dollar saved on fuel can be used to help reach another child in need.

The Reicharts feel they are often out on a limb, but are quick to add that the fruit is always at the end of the limb, so they climb out again and again. We recognize them as a body of Christian people of varying denominations united in effort to serve in furthering the kingdom.

Prayer time for Session and the entire Congregation is held each Sunday Morning at 9 AM in the Chapel. The nursery is available for children.


We will begin an **Evangelism program** this fall with Angel de la Cruz. More details to follow.

Good Reads

I know that the Lord guides my hands when choosing the books for this article. I knew I wanted a book about character and integrity. Charles Swindoll's The Quest for Character jumped right out at me. I chose another book on looks alone and it ended up being a moral code of sorts written by a Victorian Era Baptist preacher in England. I chose the third book because it was on the desk and was new to the library. It is a book that is an example of the character and integrity it takes to be a missionary to the peoples of Central Asia.

In a sermon a few weeks ago, Pastor Chris gave a paraphrased quote by N.T. Wright (translator and author of *The New Testament for Everyone*) that stuck with me. Here is the direct quote: "You don't make people better by heaping more regulations on them. Instead, what is required is the development of character." (from "The Crazy Culture of Compliance" in the Daily Mail. Charles Swindoll's book, *The Quest for Character*, is a book that the author hopes will help its readers be in constant pursuit of biblically based character. The book could be used as a devotional. There are 40 short chapters (2-4 pages long) with a small paragraph at the end of each titled "Today's Quest,"

> which gives a brief devotional and scripture to read.

I said above that I chose the second book on looks alone. *John Ploughman's Talks* is a small book

that I thought looked like a little-known book of the classic kind. While researching it, I found that to be true. It was written by Charles Haddon Spurgeon, a well-known and popular Baptist preacher in Victorian London who had much empathy with the working class people of that era. He wrote John Ploughman's Talks as a moral code for the masses. He states in the preface, "That I have written in a semihumorous vein needs no apology, since thereby sound moral teaching has gained a hearing from at least 300,000 persons. There is no particular virtue in being seriously unreadable."

At first glance, I thought Glimmers of Light in Central Asia: In His Own Words to be a children's book. On closer inspection, I found it to be a photo journal of one of our own 4R4 missionaries and a token of appreciation to all (Clen-Moore included) who have supported the mission. financially and through prayers. The book is a collection of photos from Central Asia with Bible verses that speak of God's plan for all the nations of the world to know Him. Specific information on this book is being withheld for security reasons.

I hope, with the busy holiday season coming, you will all be able to stop into the church library and check out the above books and the rest of our collection. Please have a safe and blessed Thanksgiving.
