## From the Pastor's Desk: What's the Deal With Lent?

Last Sunday someone asked me, "What's the deal with Lent?" That's a good question. The Bible doesn't say anything about Lent, so why should we "do it?" As I started to answer the question in The Messenger, I came across an article I'd saved years ago.

Barbara Brown Taylor, an Episcopal priest in Georgia, wrote an article for the magazine The Christian Century. In this excerpt she writes about Lent; why it began and why it is important:

"Little by little, Christians became devoted to their comforts instead: the soft couch, the flannel sheets, the leg of lamb roasted with rosemary. These things made them feel safe and cared for -- if not by God, then by themselves. They decided there was no contradiction between being comfortable and being Christian, and before long it was very hard to pick them out from the population at large. They no longer distinguished themselves by their bold love for one another. They did not get



arrested for championing the poor. They blended in. They avoided extremes. They decided to be nice instead of holy. and God moaned out loud.

"Hearing that, someone suggested it was time to call Christians back to their senses. and the Bible offered some clues about how to do that. Israel spent 40 years in the wilder-

Saturday, March 23 9-11AM


#### First Presbyterian Church

ness learning to trust the Lord. Elijah spent 40 days there before hearing the still, small voice of God on the same mountain where Moses spent 40 days listening to God give the law. There was also Luke's story about Jesus' own 40 days in the wilderness during which he was sorely tested by the devil. It was hard. It was awful. It was necessary, if only for the story. Those of us who believe it have proof that it is humanly possible to remain loyal to

#### God.

"So the early church announced a season of Lent, from the old English word lenten, meaning "spring" -- not only a reference to the season before Easter, but also an invitation to a springtime for the soul. Forty days to cleanse the system and open the eyes to what remains when all comfort is gone. Forty days to remember what it is like to live by the grace of God alone and not by what we can supply for ourselves.

"That hollowness we sometimes feel in our souls is not a sign of something gone wrong. It is the holy of holies inside of us, the uncluttered throne room of the Lord our God. Nothing on earth can fill it, but that does not stop us from trying. Whenever we start feeling too empty inside, we stick our pacifiers into our mouths and suck for all we are worth. They do not nourish us, but at least they plug the hole."

#### **Good Reads**

"Jesus lived on Earth, but he came to die

'Cause he loved us so—that's the reason why.

Then he rose to heaven, though he's still nearby,

For God so loved the world."

Dandi Daley Mackall wrote these words for her children's book, *For God So Loved the World: My John 3:16 Book.* Beautifully illustrated by Elena Selivanova, each page uses a short poem to embellish on that one tiny Bible verse that packs such a punch. To give children a global perspective, the words "For God So Loved the World" are featured in different languages throughout the book.

The Man Who Died for Me: Meditations on the Death and Resurrection of Our Lord by Herbert Lockyer and Six Hours One Friday: Anchoring to the Cross by Max Lucado are not children's books and do not have any beautiful pictures in them. What they do have are written illustrations that can help us prepare our hearts for the joy of Easter Morning.

Dr. Lockyer was a British pastor, teacher, and religious author, famous for his "All Series." Some of the popular volumes from that series include All the Men of the Bible, All the Women of the Bible, All the Prayers of the Bible, and All the Miracles of the Bible. The Man Who Died for Me is a collection of 18 devotional meditations that focus on the significance of the cross.

Max Lucado really needs no introduction as he is a prolific and popular author of bestsel-



ling inspirational books. Six Hours One Friday: Anchoring to the Cross is his fourth book in a list of almost one hundred books. Six Hours One Friday is written as by an observer to the events of Good Friday and the days after, but is interspersed with real life, situational stories from our times. Mr. Lucado weaves it all together to show how we are "anchored" to the cross in everything.

All three of these books would make good Lenten reading. Please stop in the church library and check them out. I hope you all have a meaningful Lenten season and a very joyous Easter!
