From the Pastor's Desk: Stepping Out and Stepping Up

In the December issue of *The Messenger*, I wrote about projects the Session has been considering to improve the use of our church building. The Session appointed a committee to look into adding a covered entrance into the church, suggest modifications to the sanctuary, and address concerns about the roof.

Thankfully, the concerns about the roof are not as great as first thought. The main roof above the sanctuary does not need to be replaced. However, there are two small roofs on either side of the sanctuary that should be replaced.

In the sanctuary, we have a proposal to update the sound system and lighting, and to add side screens and projectors. There is also a plan to modify the chancel to allow handicapped access, easier access to the choir loft, and more flexibility of space

In the Circle Drive area, the plan is to repave and widen the drive, add a covered entrance, add several handicapped parking spots, reorient the chapel to become a welcome area, and move the church offices to the current nursery. These changes will be helpful in several ways: first, it



creates an "obvious" main entrance into the church. Second, this will help to keep the building secure by allowing for only one unlocked door, close to the office.

In the coming weeks, the Session will put on display artistic renderings of the proposed changes. There will opportunities for feedback, questions, and discussion.

The building we enjoy today has been built by past generations of believers who wanted to carry on a tradition of

Mission Memo MAF: Mission Aviation Fellowship

When asked about their service with Mission Aviation Fellowship, MAF pilots usually talk about the children. The children who race after the plane when it takes off and lands... the children who laugh and pose for the camera... the little ones so eager to hear about the love of Jesus.

Lubenson is one of these. When MAF pilot Will White first saw the six-month-old Haitian orphan, he had a lifethreatening tumor the size of a baseball in his mouth. MAF flew the tiny baby to Port-au-Prince, the first step along the road to recovery.

In places where people live in isolation and poverty, afflicted by sickness and violence, the children are the ones who suffer the most. It's the smallest, the weakest, who succumb to malaria, measles, pneumonia, and other illnesses. According to the World Health Organization, every year some 8 million children in developing countries die before they reach their fifth birthday—many during the first year of life.

Things could have turned out much differently for Lubenson. He could have be-

come another statistic. But, fortunately, MAF was there to help. Lubenson recently celebrated his seventh birthday. "He is a happy, beautiful child with a great call of God

on his life!" The staff at Danita's Children make it a priority not only to clothe, feed and educate the children, but also to teach them about Jesus Christ.

"Our children will be able to look back at their childhood and see how the hand of God moved in their lives. For many of the children, if MAF was not available and willing to help in these emergency situations, their destiny would have turned out differently," says Danita Estrella-Watts, Founder and CEO.

What began with one woman and 14 orphans more than a decade ago today encompasses 80 staff members, more than 100 orphans, a feeding program of 18,000 meals a month, and schooling

for 350 children. A dental clinic was completed in 2010 and now a medical center is under construction, where visiting medical teams can work and provide quality healthcare

in an area that otherwise has none. The ministry also includes a church to nourish the souls in the community; about 500 attend.

MAF is committed to demonstrating God's love and proclaiming

the Good News to the next generation. Your gifts and prayers allow us to deliver help, healing and the hope of Jesus to those crying out in need. Thank you for standing beside us in this commission.
