# From the Pastor's Desk: Middle East Unrest

I want to share with you a letter I received from Rev. Haitham Jazwari from Kirkuk, Iraq. I had the pleasure of spending a great deal of time with Haitham on my two trips to Iraq.

"About 10:30 last night, someone knocked on our door. Being that it was so late, and because of the tenuous situation in my city, my wife and I wondered who would be knocking on our door at this hour. We were not expecting anyone. So, I was afraid to open the door and wondered if I should. I thought it might be a criminal or a militant with a gun. I didn't know what to

expect. I hesitated, but finally decided to open just a crack and ask who was out there. The person answered me, I am a Christian from the Mosul area; I am a refugee.' I didn't know if I should believe him, so I asked, 'How can I be sure you're telling the truth?' He said, 'Here is my ID card; see for yourself.' My wife was very frightened. She whispered to me to keep a distance from the stranger. I inched toward him warily. I saw his ID card. He was a refugee. He had three daughters; the oldest was not more than 5 years old. We talked



for a long while. I promised him that our church would not leave him alone.

"Please pray that we will be able to support them. The Lord has enabled us to help many displaced Iraqis, regardless of their religion or affiliation. Christ's commandment to us is not to support and help only our own; rather, his commandment is that we serve everyone in his name.

"Once again, we find ourselves faced with a new challenge. Let us

# Blood pressure screenings

will be offered at the Prime Timer's meeting on September 16 at 9:15AM in the fellowship hall. Screenings will also be done on Sunday, September 21 at the church breakfast at 8:30AM in the Fellowship Hall.

September's Health Concern:

PRESBYOPIA - a defect of vision in advancing age involving loss of accommodation (visual) due to loss of elasticity of the crystalline

lens. Onset occurs between 40 -45 years of age.

**SOLUTION:** longer arms or corrective lenses.

Additional annoying alterations in visual acuity include the glare factor, decrease in peripheral vision, color perception changes, and slowed adjustment entering into dark from sunlight. But don't attribute all visual changes to the process of aging. Timely eye exams can prevent a treatable condition from progressing to a permanent disability. (Ex: glaucoma).


