

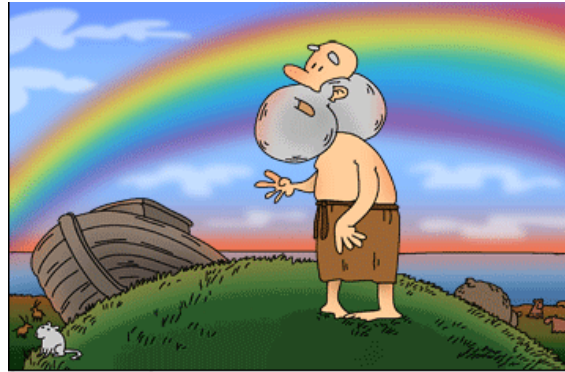
Noah's Rainbow

“Ordinary Object, Extraordinary Meanings”

“While the earth remaineth, seedtime and harvest, and cold and heat, and summer and winter, and day and night shall not cease.”

The rainbow and all the events leading up to it are another one of those great leaps of faith that we have to take if we accept the Bible to be the word of God. It is hard to comprehend that a man and his sons could build a boat large enough to house two of every living creature. It was about 450 feet long, 75 feet wide and 45 feet high, with 3 decks. Some comparisons that stand out to me include the fact that it was taller than a three story building, had deck areas that would equal 20 basketball courts, and as long as a football field. In fact, man has even built a replica of the ark itself but without all the live animals. Housekeeping must have been a real chore! I know they build much bigger buildings today, so the fact that Noah was able to do that with God's help isn't near as awesome to me as the rainbow.

Noah's sons think the ark needs a rudder. The sons are very disturbed because they thought Noah was crazy anyway, and especially if he doesn't want to put a rudder on it so he can guide it. Noah was going on God's guidance. Sometimes we are called to do something that no one else can understand, but God has a plan for us if we ask. But -"Don't ask God for guidance if you don't want it!"
