

Dear Church Family,

It feels strange to write in our newsletter for the first time without Pastor Aaron. I never liked the cliché "all good things must come to an end", but instead believe that few things in life are permanent, including pastoral tenures. We will miss the Christy family, and we should pray that God would continue to minister to them and through them in their new home. My hope is that over the summer we will take some time to recognize losses for what they are and come to a place of closure, as we prepare for a new chapter in our church life together.

As the prophet says in **Isaiah 43:19**, he reminds us "See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland." Sometimes a moment that seems empty or scarce is actually the fertile ground in which God is planting new seeds.

There are many considerations that our elders will need to discern as we move forward, such as possible staffing needs and finances, among many others. I imagine some things will take us longer that we hope they will, but as we make this transition, please pray for the elders and other leadership of the church that we might make wise, Spirit-led decisions that are perceptive of the new things sprouting up in our midst.

I also thank you in advance for your patience as I re-learn what it means to lead as a solo pastor, after having functioned in a shared co-pastoral role for the last five years.

In that same vein, I want to share some things that might help us move through this transitional period in our church. One is to note that typically, my day off will be Friday instead of Monday. It could change, but as I seek new patterns of life and work, this is my plan. One thing I have realized, often the hard way, is that when I do not observe proper sabbath, I am not at my best — mentally, physically, or spiritually. I am working hard to make Fridays a fruitful day of rest and personal worship, and I hope you will help me keep that boundary. You will frequently find me in the church on Tuesdays and Thursdays when the church office is open, so the best way to ensure my presence for you is to call, text or email to get on my schedule.

This transition gives us an opportunity to start from a clean slate. Though Aaron and I have tried our best to be faithful to God and our call to serve as shepherds of the Clen-Moore flock, we are not perfect. I invite you to share constructive feedback with the elders and me. It will help this new chapter of ministry to be more fruitful and faithful to our work as a church. Aaron's departure has already caused me to look in the mirror and ask the Lord where I need to grow and mature in my own leadership, and it's a journey we should all take together.

Last but not least, the key word is TOGETHER. The church isn't a building, but rather the people who gather in the building. Similarly, the life and faith of a church does not (or should not) rest solely on the shoulders of the pastor. I try to set a high example to emulate, to be well read so I am an adequate teacher of scripture, and a person of prayer and deep faith as a leader. But it takes the entire body of Christ to be the church, and so this is a reminder that we may all be called to greater responsibility to participate in the life of our church. We have a strong family of faith at Clen-Moore, and I believe our current circumstances will make us stronger if we draw closer together.

It has been a privilege to be your pastor for the last five years, and though some of my role, function, and title will be shifting, I am excited and eager to serve for many more years to come.

Christmas in July! Mission project for 5 Star Global Ministry

Last year we collected over 600 shelf stable proteins to provide a Christmas meal for the families that 5 Star serves in Haiti. This year we will collect hygiene products that will be given to families, as well as some canned foods that will be used for the Christmas meal at the party. Soon you will find a Christmas tree in the sanctuary covered in "tags" that have items we're seeking to collect on them (including the quanti-ty.) Take one (or more) tags and commit to bringing those items back by the end of July so they can be packaged and shipped in early August. Autumn Marshall has instructed us to buy generic items, because generic items in the US are like brand name products in Haiti.

For the hygiene packs we will need 200 of the following items. Each of these items is close to \$5US or more in Haiti right now and all can be gotten for \$1-\$1.50 at dollar tree, dollar general, Ollies or Walmart if you get off brands: baby powder (regular size), toothpaste (regular size tube), deodorant, bar soap, lotion.

For the Christmas meal we'll need 20 cans of SPAM, 10 cans of peas, 10 cans of carrots, 10 cans of corn, and 6 large powder drink cool aid mix. Please take the tags to help us track what has been claimed and what is needed or contact the church office to find out what items are yet to be claimed. We will place the collected items under the tree through July. Thank you again for your continued support of this mission!


