Dear church family,

As we look toward the summer, we have a lot happening in the life of our congregation. Church softball season is in full swing, and I hope you can come out and spend time with us, even if you're unable to play. The middle of the month brings us to VBS as we take a trip to Camp Firelight with a kick-off meal after worship for everyone on Sunday, June 16. The following Saturday, we will have our rummage sale outside under the tent. Among many exciting events and programs, we finish the month by worshipping with Shenango Presbyterian Church for their last worship service on Sunday, June 30.

I want to begin by honoring the several centuries of ministry that have happened through our sister church, one of the oldest Presbyterian churches in the county founded in 1801! This congregation was partially responsible for founding the church that would eventually be named Clen-Moore. It is hard to quantify Shenango Church's impact on our local community, global mission, and ultimately the kingdom of God. Though we mourn their closure, we also celebrate and give thanks for their 223 years in New Castle and Lawrence County.

It may be bittersweet to see our brothers and sisters close the doors of their congregation, but it is also a strong reminder of our calling as the body of Christ. We often view church through the lens of earthly success, especially tangible things—money, people, programs, building size, and the ability to keep those things afloat. When it comes to the kingdom of God, Jesus never promises that specific congregations, institutions, ministries, or programs will exist forever. When Peter proclaims Jesus to be the Messiah in Matthew 16:18, he responds by proclaiming "and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it."

As we walk alongside our brothers and sisters at Shenango Presbyterian Church, whether they choose to join our fellowship at Clen-Moore or another church family, we rejoice in the promise that the universal Church will never die. Specific institutions may come and go, but in the same ways that our salvation is secure, so is the future of Christ's church.

As I approach six years of pastoral ministry here at Clen-Moore, I have a great deal of hope for our future, for the ways God is calling us to live, serve, and worship. But moments like the one we will share with Shenango Church remind us that the Church is also bigger than any one congregation. We are blessed to be among many tribes (local congregations) that seek to contribute to the kingdom of God. May the events of this month remind us that we are mighty and valued—because God has called us together to be his church, the hands and feet of Jesus here on earth.

Building the Perfect Bedtime Snack includes these tips for better sleep:

- 1. Strive for a combo of carbs and protein to promote satiety and support the production of serotonin, a precursor of sleep-promoting melatonin.

  (Ex: whole grain cereal and low-fat milk)
- 2. Choose lower fat options-lying down after a high fat meal or snack can disrupt digestion, causing acid reflux and nausea. (Ex: hummus and pita chips or veggie sticks)
  - 3. Consider hydrating foods-fruits and veggies provide extra water and key minerals which help produce better sleep, muscle and nerve function.
