


The Clen-Moore Messenger



Dear church family,

Have you ever forgotten a birthday, anniversary, or other important milestone celebration? I have to admit that while it crossed my mind several times, I have been remiss in promoting a milestone for Clen-Moore—this year marks our church's 175th year of ministry in New Castle! Our names and faces have changed over the years, but we are privileged to continue the work of our ancestors from many generations ago.

We will celebrate with a homecoming of sorts on Sunday, October 20th, and welcome guest preacher Rev. Mike Loudon. He was raised at Clen-Moore, and later went on to serve churches in the New Castle area in the 1970s-80s, and then in Lincoln, Nebraska in the late 1980s and 1990s. He most recently served First Presbyterian Church of Lakeland, Florida for nearly twenty years before his retirement in 2018. Mike is quite the history buff, so he is excited to share more about our church's history and ministry. Following worship, we will hold our annual "Harvest Dinner" fellowship luncheon.

Most of us cannot take credit for the majority of Clen-Moore's history—the oldest long-standing members don't even account for half of our church's lifespan. We can, however, continue the legacy of faith that was handed down to us by faithful Christians we have never met--by doing the same for those who will come after us. More than a century ago, members of Clen-Moore couldn't have imagined what our church and Christianity as a whole would look like in modern times. But here we are, following in the footsteps of those who have come before us. The question that remains is how we respond to the gifts we've been given.

One way is to give thanks—have gratitude for the sacrifices, faithfulness, and wisdom of pastors, elders, teachers, and members who established and enabled our congregation. There are many churches that haven't or will not exist for 175 years. Additionally, we should seek to build on our foundation. Too often we measure the "success" of a church by things that are easily measured such as money and people. But neither gives a true indication of faithful worship, ministry, and mission dedicated to Jesus Christ. It is possible to have few people and little money and be quite faithful—we see that in the lives of our Christian brothers and sisters in underdeveloped countries. The opposite can also be true. Having an abundance of people or finances does not automatically equate faithfulness to Jesus.

I am reminded of Jesus' words in Luke 16:10, from the New Living Translation: "If you are faithful in little things, you will be faithful in large ones. But if you are dishonest in little things, you won't be honest with greater responsibilities." The way we honor and continue the work of our spiritual ancestors through Clen-Moore Church is being faithful in little ways that build on one another. Like our ancestors, we have no idea what the church may look like in a few years, let alone in another century. But if we remain faithful to the little ways Jesus is calling us to live, worship, and serve, it is likely that 25 years from now, we can celebrate another milestone in the community of faith that we call Clen-Moore Presbyterian Church.
